RUN FOR THE WORLD 20 YEARS AND RUNNING STRONG

Run for the World will celebrate its 20th anniversary on February 20th. This 5K run/walk was begun in 1990 by a team of church members who saw the enormous needs of those around the world and felt called to find a way to raise the finances to offer them aid. Today their commitment continues and all proceeds from our sponsors and the race participants go to local, national and international missions.

Each year hundreds of people take to the 3.1 mile course that heads down Fairpoint Drive, continues around Highpoint Drive until it returns up Nightingale Lane to the finish line. One of last year's runners shared exactly why she was there at 8:00 on a Saturday morning. "Run for the World is the first race I ever ran in. I was never really a runner before that, I would occasionally run on the treadmill but that was about it. I can't believe it, but it was 9 years ago that I saw the ad for the race the day before and decided to sign up. I loved the feeling of camaraderie and I've been running ever since. Running has built my confidence and seen me through some really tough times in my life. The \$17 is a fantastic price for a race and it's great that it all goes to help those in need. "

A Message from Pastor Jack



66 books make up the Bible. 49 of them are in the Hebrew Scriptures or Old Testament, while only 27 of them are in the New Testament. Written over hundreds of years and including poetry, prophecy, correspondence, narrative, song, and history, these books contain God's message to the world. That message is "I love you."

At the dawn of creation, we learn that God saw that it was not good for us to be alone. Adam wasn't enough. So God created Eve, so that neither one would be alone. When I have felt alone in the world, I have been grateful for the companionship of family, church, and mentors in my life. God still doesn't want us to be alone. It was the message in Genesis and it is still one of God's messages today.

Then came the prophets. God spoke through burning bushes, beasts of burden, colorful men, and kings. Their messages called the people of God to justice and to move toward God's kingdom here on earth. They would speak for the people to God and for God to the people. Their presence would lead God's people from slavery to freedom, from sin to redemption, and from selfishness to sacrifice. God spoke through them to say that we are not alone.

Next, Jesus came. He continued the message of the prophets, but summed all their work up with the greatest message: "I love you." He said it summed up the law. He said it was the best way to treat your enemies. He said that was the way people would know we were his followers. It was the final question he asked Peter... "Do you love me?"

God's message is as clear now as it was in Genesis. "I love you."

So, how do I deal with feelings of loneliness? What can I say to the message of the prophets in my time? How can I respond to God's grace when it comes my way in 2010?

For starters, I see that God has given me a companion, mentor, leader, and prophet for my life and ministry. That man is Herb Sadler.

God gave him to our community....to our church...and to me.

God didn't want us to be alone. God wanted us to hear a vision of justice and hope. God wants us to move to the promised land. God gave us that message through the sacred text of scripture and God gave us that message through Herb.

For that, I can only reply to God what God said to us by giving him to us. "We love you, too."

Missions Spotlight "What is Angelfood Ministries Anyway?"



Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing grocery relief to communities throughout the United States. There are no qualifications, minimums, income restrictions,

or applications needed to participate in Angelfood ministries. The program began in 1994 with 34 families in Monroe, Georgia and has grown to serve hundreds of thousands of families every month across 35 states. Angelfood Ministries program here at Gulf Breeze United Methodist Church began in November of 2008 when we joined up with "It's a Blessing" ministry in Pensacola, Florida and because of you, we have served hundreds of families this past year and have also been able to donate many boxes of food, each month to families in a time of crisis and need! Thank you for your continued prayers and support!!



How much does it cost and what do I get for my money?

Angel Food is available in a standard medium-sized box at \$30 per unit. Each month's menu is different than the previous month and consists

of fresh, frozen and packaged food, and always includes a generous amount of meat, vegetables, a dessert item, eggs and stable milk.



But it's just my husband and I and we don't need all that food.

Specialty boxes may now be purchased with or without the purchase of a standard box. You can choose from a

meat grill box, a meat and chicken combo box, seafood pack, fajita kit or fresh fruit and veggie box. There's even a box for people on the go, ten perfectly seasoned fully cooked meals to just heat and serve.



"Isn't that like a meal program for those in need?"

Angelfood ministries is not just for those families in need, but rather for anyone wanting to stretch their dollar just a little further. When you purchase

Angelfood, you are not taking away from those in need, but rather helping this program succeed. For every regular unit sold, we receive one dollar towards a benevolence fund. We use that fund every month to purchase more boxes of food for those in our church family and community who need a "hand up" in a time of economic challenge. At least ten extra boxes a month go to those who truly are in need. Even if you don't order Angelfood for your family you can make a donation to GBUMC marked Angelfood.



Isn't it all old, gross food?

Angelfood is purchased from the nation's top food suppliers. The food is all the same high quality one could purchase at a grocery

store. There are no second-hand items, no damaged or out-dated goods, no dented cans without labels, no day-old breads and no produce that is almost too ripe.
